Les Buis

The limestone in the soil brings mineral notes to the wine, a real portrait of its terroir. This plot was the first to be certified Organic.

Jurassic

The lime and clay geology of the region comes from tropical marine sediment. Fossils and limestone abound, and are reflected in the names of our hamlets: Les Chailloux (The Stones), Les Cras (The Skulls), Sur La Carrière (On The Quarry), Les Rochats (The Rocks)..



The Maillettes

The history of this Domain begins here, in 1969. Maurice and Claudia, at forty years old, turned their enthusiasm into hard work to set in motion a wine legacy that is still only just beginning.



The cellar

Built after the turn of the millennium, this cellar takes inspiration from typical Mâcon buildings with a Mâconnais gallery overlooking the cellar entrance. Here, carved into the stone, is where we age our wine.



Davayé

The best-known village in Saint-Véran also lends its name to a small wine-producing area in the Mâcon-Villages.
