

#### THE HISTORY OF VIRGINIA WINE

In the year 1619 *Vitis Vinifera* vines were first brought from Europe with eight *vignerons* recruited

from France to make wine in Jamestown, Virginia. Given the success of that planting and subsequent growth cycle, 10,000 more vines were planted by 1621. Therein lies the true origin of Virginia as the cradle of America's wine industry.

#### THE WINE OF VIRGINIA'S HISTORY



16 of Virginia's top producers joined the unique collaboration Each were asked to each donate a barrel of their best red wine, using the best of what Virginia offers; Merlot, Cabernet Sauvignon, Cabernet Franc, Petit Verdot and Tannat.

The wines were blended and aged 16 months in Virginia Oak barrels, bottled in August 2018, giving us the limited-edition commemorative wine Virginia's Heritage.

#### The wine itself is something special.

Virginia's Heritage is led with Merlot and Petit Verdot. Cabernet Sauvignon, Tannat then Cabernet Franc supporting the blend. The wine seems more of a Spanish Rioja Alta style than of Bordeaux blend as first expected. Dark fruit such as wild black cherry, spicy notes of cinnamon and vanilla and on the nose and mid-pallet. A pleasant earthy and smokiness with good texture, a long, refined finish with notes of sweet tobacco, cedar and spice, cherry liqueur aftertaste which will further develop over time in the bottle.

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
