ABOUT THE ESTATE

Château Les Bouysses is an ancient priory rich of 800 years of history. It was bought by the Marre Family in 1933. "Bouyssesé is the old French word for "buis" — the boxwood that border the alleys of the property. The 30 hectare-estate is located in the town of Mercues nearby Cahors in the Southwest of France. It is planted with 24 hectares of vines and 6 hectares of walnut trees.

ABOUT THE WINE

The wine boasts a beautiful dark brilliant ruby purple color. The nose is complex with loads of black cherry, blackberry with a hint of violet, followed by a buttery and vanilla note. The palate is rich, powerful, with smooth and melted tannins. This wine is fleshy and velvety.

Varietal(s)	100% Malbec
Vinification	The grapes are machine harvested and destemmed. Alcoholic fermentation at 28°C for 25 days in stainless steel vats with control of the temperatures. Matured in French oak barrels for 12 months
Soil Type	Gravel soils with iron rich veins
Food pairing	game meat, red meat, duck confit, and goat cheese.
