Winery: Bastgen

Region: Mosel, Germany

Variety: Riesling

Flavour: Dry

Winemaker: Armin Vogel

Vintage: 2021, cool and wet year with high minerality and well-integrated acidity

Site: Cueser-Weisenstein, southwest facing vineyard, long sun exposure, bridle clay slate, 40 year-old vines

Winemaking: highly selective hand-harvest, fermented with native yeast in traditional foudre barrel (1000L), 8 months on the lees, bottled in August 2022

Bottles made: 1,300

Tasting Notes: This wine gives off an expressive nose of black currant, grapefruit and a touch of brown honey paired with a cool flintiness. On the palate, it is completely dry, structured and has a long mineral finish.

Analysis: 12 %vol., 3,4 g/l Rs., 8,3 g/l Acidity

Pairing suggestions: ocean cuisine

Critic's review: 2021 was never tasted but 2022 received 95 points by James Suckling, 2021 in our humble opinion is the even better year.
