

Bertrand Bachelet Chassagne Montrachet Rouge

Domaine Bertrand Bachelet

France - Burgundy - Chassagne-Montrachet

The Chassagne-Montrachet appellation is originally better known for its white wines, but also produces high quality red wines. The complexity of the terroir allows both varieties to thrive side by side.

The wine is produced from vineyards located in the villages of Les Lombardes and Les Benoites that benefit from iron rich clay soils. A ruby garnet color, and an expressive nose of spices and red fruits that echo on the palate.

Soil type	iron-rich clay soils
Vinification	When they reach the vat room, the grapes are rigorously sorted. Then they are destemmed and vinified in concrete vats for about three weeks; during this period, remontage is favored over pigeage to encourage freshness and a silky texture. Ageing in wood for around twelve months (about 20% new barrels), followed by a period of 8 months in stainless steel vats before bottling.
Pairings	Pairs well with a nice cut of red meat.
